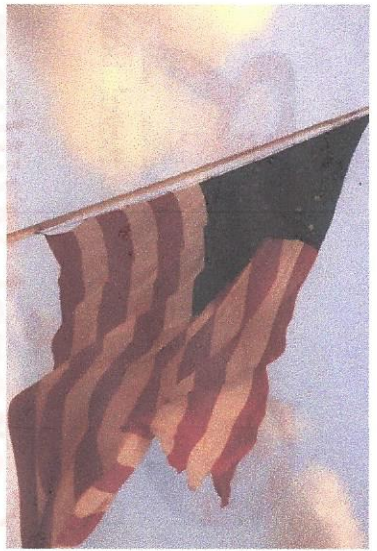

The pledge of Allegiance to the flag of the United States of America:

one Nation under God, indivisible, with liberty and justice for all.

Object of the C.A.R.:

The Object of this Society shall be:

1. To acquire knowledge of American History.
2. To preserve and restore Places of Historical importance associated with men and women who forwarded American Independence.
3. To ascertain the deeds and honor the memories of the men, women and children who rendered service to the cause of the American Revolution.
4. To promote the celebration of patriotic anniversaries.
5. To honor and cherish the Flag of the United States of America above every other flag.
6. To love, uphold and extend the principles of American liberty and patriotism.

So...who can join C.A.R.?

"Any young person under the age of twenty-two is eligible for membership in The National Society of the Children of the American Revolution. The prospective member must be **linearly** descended from a man or woman who, with unflinching loyalty, rendered material aid to the cause of American Independence as a soldier, sailor, civil officer, or recognized patriot in one of the several Colonies or States, or of the United States. The prospective member also must be personally acceptable to the respective society."
